Disaster training in Shilo May 6

Don't be alarmed next Thursday, May 6 to see several fire trucks, ambulances and police vehicles invading Shilo.

police vehicles invading Shilo.

It will be all part of CFB / ASU Shilo's first ever Grand Valley Mutual Aid training day held at the Shilo Emergency Services (SES) Training Complex off Horsham Road. Some 36 emergency personnel will take part in training lasting most of the morning.

According to SES Chief Dennis Hurley, action will get underway next Thursday around 9:30 a.m. with Shilo fire trucks, ambulance and Military Police heading down Royal Avenue towards Horsham, then out to the training facility. There they will be joined by emergency crews from Brandon, Wawanesa and Carberry, as well as 11 Health Services personnel.

"They won't have their lights and sirens going, and road traffic will be down until 10 a.m. The explosions (that were earlier planned) have been cancelled and some may notice some smoke," the fire chief advised.

Because it will be a mock disaster training, a couple of actors will be made up in accident simulation, Chief Hurley warns, with ambulances speeding from the fire training centre to the medical clinic.

As an added feature, the *Shilo Stag* will assist with on-scene scenario training. This includes *Stag* staff acting out a scene during the training exercise, as a test of onsite commanders' ability to control media during an emergency.

Chief Hurley says it is vital to be able to offer this kind of mutual aid training on a regular basis. Similar training was staged last year at the Brandon Airport.

"Mutual aid is a no cost, reciprocal agreement between neighbouring fire departments to assist when a fire exceeds capability. Grand Valley Mutual aid is comprised of Shilo, Brandon, Wawanesa, Carberry and Souris plus industrial partners such as Canexus and Koch," he says.



MLA Leanne Rowat thanks veterans in legislature

For Leanne Rowat, MLA Minnedosa Constituency, honouring World First veterans in the Manitoba Legislature was itself a

huge honour. On April 9, Vimy Ridge Day, she read a Private Member's Statement in front of the House in the presence of several Armed Forces members. Then on April 19 she addressed a letter to LCol Luc Généreux, BComd of CFB / ASU Shilo detailing her statement which was based on her trip to the Vimy Ridge Memorial in November, 2009.

"Today, anniversary of the battle of Vimy Ridge, I rise in the House to pay tribute to the brave Canadians who died during the First World War and those that have recently passed. On Sunday, Nov. 8 of last year, I had the honour of participating in the Remembrance Day ceremony held at Vimy Ridge National Historic Site of Canada. It was a privilege to pay tribute to those who served in the First World War and provided me an opportunity to extend my sincere appreciation to all Canadians who have made sacrifices in times of conflict and peace alike.

in this battle alone. I will never forget Vimy Ridge and how, even with a heavy heart, how very proud I was to represent Manitoba in laying a wreath of remembrance. The anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge serves to remind us of the sacrifices that were made over 90 years ago. Lest we forget," Rowat said in her Private Member Statement.

Earlier Legislature that day, Premier Greg Selinger rose to acknowledge the passing of John 'Jack' Babcock, Canada's last World known First The War veteran. premier also noted that 18,000 Manitobans had volunteered by the end of 1914, with 14 Manitobans awarded the Victoria Cross for bravery.

"On behalf of of members this Chamber and all the citizens of Manitoba, I would like to extend my deepest gratitude to all of Canada's veterans. We will never forget the sacrifices you have made, nor will we ever relinquish the freedoms you fought to preserve," the premier stated.

McFadyen, Hugh Leader of the Official Opposition supported the government's request for a moment of silence.

"I am very honoured recognize those who made such great sacrifices on the part of our country and those who believe in freedom, and still do."



New off-leash dog park to open by late May

Expect construction to start later this spring on an 175 by 150 foot offlease dog park between the Faith Centre and the tobogganing hill.

At the Shilo Community Council meeting held April 14, Council Chair Capt Jim Rees said \$10,000 has been approved to build the park which is expected to open the end of May. This money, approved through Base Fund, would be used mainly to purchase and install fencing around the park perimeter.

Some of those at the packed council meeting asked if that area was the ideal one for such a park. The suggestion was made that perhaps the soccer field beside Ecole la Source could be used, while others suggested vacant areas left behind by recent PMQ demolition.

"It had to be in an area where the engineers could support it," Capt. adding stated, Rees that engineers wanted to avoid areas with underground services and those set aside for

future growth.
"We are also looking at being close to the residential area and not on top of playgrounds," the council chair remarked.

Brette LeBlanc, FS&R asked Representative,

if the dog park would be a better fit for dog owners if it was larger. She pointed out a similar park in Brandon is 300 by 150 feet in size.

Capt. Rees replied he could make no promises, but he would take the request for extra funding back to Base Fund.

Community clean up

Council announced that the week of April 26 to 30 has been deemed Community Clean Up. Residents of PMQs will be asked to clean up the area around their houses, while Boy Scouts will clean up park areas. The council will donate \$600 to the Scout Pack for this work. Then on Sunday, June 6 look for the Community Yard Sale which includes a centralized barbecue hosted by the School Parent Council. Watch for more announcements in the *Stag* closer to the event.

Survey forthcoming?

Concerned about bank machine hours, or how to post a letter on base after hours? Shilo council is considering these and several other issues and hope to get your feedback through a possible Shilo-wide survey. More on that possibility in the near future.

The next Shilo Community Council set for meeting is Wednesday, May 19 at 1 p.m., at a location to be determined.

Do you have a Pleasure Craft Operators Card?

Transport Canada and the Canadian Coast Guard have brought in mandatory boating safety certification for boaters. The regulations have been phased in, but this is the final phase. As of September 15, 2009 all boaters require a "Pleasure Craft Operators Card" or face fines and invalid liability insurance.

The Competency of Operators of Pleasure Craft Regulations which fall within the Canada Shipping Act, 2001 require operators of pleasure craft in Canada, fitted with a motor and used for recreational purposes, to have proof of competency on board with them at all times. The regulation applies to sailboats that are fitted with auxiliary motors and to personal watercraft, not just to motorboats. A fine (\$250, in the form of a ticket) can be levied by a law enforcement officer upon an operator who fails to show proof of competency (as prescribed within the federal Contraventions Regulations / Contraventions Act).

Examples of pleasure

Powerboats

Personal watercraft (PWC) – i.e. Jet Ski

Canoes and kayaks (fitted with a motor)

Sailboats or sailboards

Hovercraft (Air cushion vehicles, ACV)

If your water craft is fitted with a motor (whether it is turned on or not) you must have a Pleasure Card Operator

Proof of operator competency can take one of three forms:

A Pleasure Craft Operator Card;

Proof of having successfully completed a boating safety course in

Canada prior to April 1, 1999; or,

A completed rentalboat safety checklist.





History on display


Souris was settled in the early 1880s by Squire Sowden who headed a colonization party of 36. To gain easier access to his properties, in 1904 the Squire built a suspension bridge across the Souris River. That bridge is known today as the Swinging Bridge and is a Manitoba Star Attraction.

In 1910 Fred Sowden, son of the town founder, built Squire Hill. That mansion is today's Hillcrest Museum and houses several period displays along with a collection of 5,000 butterflies from around world. Hillcrest Museum has been named one of Canada's top 64 heritage properties.

Deployment info you need

The Mission Information Line (MIL) has been helping families experiencing deployment for over 18 years. Just as the nature of Canadian Forces (CF) deployments have changed over time, the concerns of MIL callers have also evolved.

This winter, the MIL was especially busy answering calls and updating messages about the deployment of CF personnel to Haiti for Operation Hestia. An officer from the Disaster Assistance Response Team provided updates to an automated MIL message box almost daily so that families could hear firsthand how their loved ones were helping with the relief effort.

"Families called in regularly to hear about everything from the first baby born in the CF makeshift hospital, to how many litres of water they had made safe for drinking, to how the people of Haiti are doing," says Robin Whitford, MIL Manager.

"Though this deployment happened suddenly, it was great that word of mouth let people know where to call for information. During the two month deployment, the message boxes dedicated to Op Hestia re-



ceived over 1,000 hits!"

The MIL provides message boxes dedicated to each military operation on deployment, and works with CF personnel to keep the boxes updated regularly. Families can call and listen to the recorded messages at any time to get a sense of what their loved ones have recently experienced, and feel connected even through they may be far apart.

Message boxes can also provide updates for families on when to expect their loved ones back from deployment.

"Deployment Support Centres can use their message boxes to record the flight return timings of the soldiers returning from tour. As flight information can change right up until the last minute, the Deployment Support Centres are able

to update this information with one simple recording and hundreds of families are able to call as often as they wish. During this anxious time, many families call repeatedly!"

In addition to message boxes, the MIL also provides families with access to a counselor from 8 a.m. until midnight (EST), Monday-Friday by pressing '0'. Callers can also leave messages for the MIL and all messages will be returned. Urgent messages will be returned even on weekends and holidays.

Whether callers working up to a deployment, already have a loved one overseas, or the reunion has brought its own set of challenges, the MIL can help make the transitions easier for families. The MIL's services don't start only when a loved one departs, and they don't end when the planes land back in Canada. Families are welcome to call the MIL anytime with their questions, concerns or even just to talk.


