Hillier signs on for Gala, tix going fast

Don't even think about waffling on whether to get tickets for the May 22 Hero's Gala featuring Gen Rick Hillier (ret'd), the Canadian Forces Air Command Band and the pomp and pageantry of a formal mess dinner.

Organizer Steve Morrison, Chair of the Brandon Salutes Committee, says about three-quarters of the 38 tables available are already spoken for, and the rest are going fast

"I expect this event will sell out. I would not want to wait too long. This seems to be a very popular event," Morrison stated.

The big date is coming up on Saturday, May 22 at the Victoria Inn Grand Salon at 3550 Victoria Ave. W. Cocktails will be served at 5:30 p.m. with dinner slated for 6 p.m.

All money raised that night will fund the Project Hero initiatives at Brandon University and Assiniboine Community College. Project Hero was launched in 2009 by Gen. Hillier and Honorary Lt. Colonel Kevin Reed with a mandate of funding scholarships to families of fallen Canadian soldiers.

The evening, co-sponsored by CFB/ASU Shilo, is also an opportunity for area businesses to step up to the plate. Sponsorship packages ranging from \$75 to \$5,000 have been established as part of the evening's \$10,000 fundraising goal. Charitable tax credits are available.

Shilo celebrates International Women's Week

Equality of women in Canadian society is on the rise, but many thirdworld countries still have a long way to go in the way their societies devalue women, according to Dr. Deborah Poff, guest speaker at Shilo's International Women's Week (IWW) celebration.

Dr. Poff, President and Vice-Chancellor of Brandon University, spoke to a crowd of 50 at the Community Centre on March 11. She said the majority of Canadian university students are female, and the Canadian government currently has the highest percentage in history of women in Cabinet, with 67. Both of these statistics contribute to IWW's 2010 theme "Strong Women. Strong Canada. Strong World."

There are countries around the world, however, that still have a vast amount of catching up to do. Sixty-two million girls

The body of Duane hn Lacquette was John found in a Brandon duplex on Jan. 16.


Ouimet made a brief appearance in Brandon court on March 8 with the matter put off for another six weeks.

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worldwide do not attend school, according to the U.N., and although there are a variety of contributing factors, Dr. Poff believes the huge differences between Western and Islamic cultures are partly to blame. She said that North Americans live in a society where a large value is placed on "things," rather than on people.
"Some of (the devaluing

of women) is a...backlash against what they think is a material, wasted, capitalist, democratic world," Dr. Poff explained. "I think that's hard for us to understand. I think we look like a shallow, empty society to people who have different values."

Dr. Poff said she believes certain cultures react to what they view as "false values" in Western society.

"(Their reaction is) we'll take women and we'll veil them and we'll keep them away from education and ideas and freedom," Dr. Poff stated.

She believes Canada

is doing a "wonderful thing" by being a presence in Afghanistan.

"The Canadian government has opened a window to expose the terrible, terrible things that are happening when girls try to go to school," Dr. Poff said. "The problem is, we can't seem to get into a di-alogue with those people so that we could come to some common vision."

Dr. Poff pointed out that not all Islamic cultures oppress women.

"There are tolerant Islam cultures where women are professors, and they become medical doctors and engineers."

Lt Ellery Burton was one of a handful of men who attended Dr. Poff's lecture. He believes Canadians have "a somewhat sheltered view of the world" in terms of equal-

"There are places in the world where women are brutalized for attempting to attend school or find employment," Lt Burton said. "In Canada, we can see that women complement any team dynamic, whether in a marriage, a family, or at work, and they play an important role in all facets of life."

A rededication of the Memorial Cup in Shilo will be a huge part of the 10-day Memorial Cup tournament coming up in Brandon in mid-May.





Shilo soldiers carry Olympic pride into Paralympic Games

CFB Shilo soldiers MCpl Adam Cyr and Cpl Lance Lafleur are among hundreds of disabled athletes Vancouver 2010 Paralympic Games now on until March 21.

pride National skyrocketed as Canadians came together to support athletes and to showcase Canada to the world at the Olympics. Catching the momentum from wave of energy, the Paralympics started on March 12. This is the first time that the Paralympics has been held on Canadian soil and the athletes are ready.

Paralympic The Games grew out of the Stoke Mandeville Games in 1948 at the Stoke Mandeville Spinal Injuries Unit in the United Kingdom. Sir Ludwig Guttmann, a neurosurgeon, realized that sport motivated injured soldiers, sailors and airmen and women improve their strength and well-being. He started up sport competitions within his rehabilitation programs. This has grown into international competition where elite

athletes dig deep to

achieve their goals. Canada's Paralympic team of 55 athletes will be participating in five winter sports: Para-Alpine Skiing, Biathlon, Cross-Country Skiing, Ice Sledge Hockey, and Wheel Chair Curling.

Athletes competing at Paralympic Games are classified into categories to keep the competition fair. This also happens in able-bodied sports. For example, boxers compete against others in the same weight category. The classifications are amputee, spinal cord injury, cerebral palsy, visual impairment and Les Autres (which in French means "the others." This category is for those athletes whose physical disabilities are not within the other four categories).

Some sports are further classified as well. Skiing events are divided into Standing, Sitting, and Visually Impaired categories. Wheel Chair Curling and Sledge do not have Hockey competitive specific classifications athletes are evaluated to determine whether they are eligible to compete in the sport. The five winter sports are divided into 64 different events.

Fund Program goals similar to the Paralympics. It provides resources for ill or injured Canadian Forces personnel and former personnel to attain and maintain a healthy active lifestyle through physical fitness, recreation and sport.

Soldier On OP SANS LIMITES is sending 15 soldiers from across Canada to Vancouver 2010 Paralympics.

The aim of Operation: Sans Limites is to inspire injured ill Canadian Forces personnel to experience

the sense of confidence and empowerment that comes with enjoying sport at all levels, from playground to the Paralympic Games; and to honour the military origins of the Paralympic Movement.

There are three CF members from Joint Personnel Support Unit-Prairie Region Element, who will be representing Team Soldier On: MCpl Adam Cyr (Shilo), Cpl Lance Lafleur (Shilo), and Cpl Ryan Elrick (Winnipeg). They will be able to participate in a Sledge Hockey Clinic and Curling Clinic prior to the start of the games, and then spectate at a variety of events.

Team Soldier On will be joined by injured/ ill military personnel from Great Britain (15 personnel confirmed) and the United States (up to 30 personnel). Canada, USA and Great Britain joining forces once again is symbolic of the origins of the Paralympic movement as these three countries formed the largest contingents of Allied troops during the Second World War.

Well Water Testing

for landowners with private wells

Well owners should test their water regularly.

The Manitoba government monitors groundwater quality through provincial sampling programs. In most cases, the water meets health guidelines but regular testing by well owners is recommended.

Bacteria - Wells should be tested for bacteria every year. In addition, wells should be tested if spring run-off or flood waters may have affected the well, or there is any reason to believe that well water quality has changed. The Manitoba government subsidizes the cost of bacteria testing for one sample per year. If this test shows your water is contaminated, the provincial government will pay for a second test to confirm the results.

Nitrate - In some wells throughout the province, the levels of nitrate exceed the drinking water guidelines. Nitrate should be tested every three to five years. In addition, wells should be tested if there is a pregnant woman or a baby in the home, if there is a noticeable change in the taste, smell, colour or clarity of the water, or there is any reason to believe that the well water quality may have changed.

Trace elements - In some parts of the province, well water may contain naturallyoccurring elements, such as arsenic, barium, boron, fluoride and uranium, in amounts that exceed drinking water guidelines. Testing for trace elements is recommended every three to five years. Maps are available on-line showing areas where levels tend to be high.

Why would I sign up for an appetizer class?

When I walked into the servery at the Community Centre I was surprised to see that almost everyone was there and ready to go. We were just waiting on a few more. The room was buzzing

with anticipation of the new tastes our pallets would enjoy.

The instructor Chris is a chef by trade. Does he ever know his stuff, and cutting/chopping skills were impressive. He gives credit to his knife, but we all knew that there was skill involved. He said it's all about presentation and

it showed that he took pride in his finished product. The veggies were all the same size small, long and square – julienne style. Because time was tight, only two hours for the workshop, most of the prep work was done by Chris ahead of time. It made our job extremely easy.

We started by making rice paper rolls. The rice paper is a really neat way of wrapping things up. A bit slimy to touch but really easy to work with. Everyone had hands on experience of rolling and

The lettuce wraps were extremely tasty but really messy. The combination of chicken, water chestnuts, spices and lettuce was appealing to our taste buds.

Then came roasted red pepper and feta purses. We learned about different kinds of rice and when to use them. This used Arborio rice because

of its creamy texture. Did you know that when a recipe calls for roasted red pepper all you need to do is BBQ a red pepper brushed with olive oil for about 10 minutes? Once it's nice and black, that's right, burnt, you shock the pepper by placing it in cold water. This stops the cooking process as well as peels the pep-per. You then remove the seeds, chop up and voila, roasted red pepper.

We used phyllo sheets (a thin, light pastry sheet) to make the purses. It was amazing to work with and I will definitely be buying this product. Who knew there was this product on the market

that could make anyone appear to know what they are doing. For the purses we cut squares of three by three and made cute little stuffed purses. I really enjoyed making these and we used blanched julienne leek to tie the tops. What a great way to impress your guests. Some participants found this a bit tedious so we improvised and also made them in muffin tins. They were less work, just as tasty as well as an impressive presentation.

The last item to wrap up was vegetable samosas in the phyllo sheets. Once again, I was amazed at how easy this

pastry is easy to work with. We brainstormed on all the other foods we could make with these sheets.

Before we knew it, it was time to clean up and head home. We all left the workshop with our bellies full and eager to try the new techniques we had learned. Some have already signed up for the next cooking class with Chris - A Taste of Thai on Wed., Apr. 14. If you are up for a fun evening join us.


