60th anniversary of memorial observed

As dawn broke over a frozen CFB Shilo on Nov. 20, Veterans and current soldiers marked the 60th anniversary of the Canoe River Tragedy.

The ceremony at the Canoe River Memorial last Saturday was conducted by Regt Maj Rob Hart of RCA, assisted by RCA Museum Director Marc George and Padre Lt. (N) Earl Klotz. Following an Act of Remembrance, Prayers and Benediction, George read the names of soldiers losing their lives in 1950:

on its way to Washington State prior to sailing for Korea. On Nov. 21, 1950, the westbound mostly wooden troop train slammed head on into a heavier eastbound passenger train near Canoe River, BC. A total of 17 soldiers lost their lives, along with two engineers and two brakemen in each of the two locomotives.

According to Veterans Affairs Canada, the collision all those years ago is thought to be due to a misunderstanding.

"The eastbound passenger train expected to meet a troop train at Cedarside, east of where the collision occurred, while the westbound troop train expected to meet the passenger train at Gosnell which is west of the scene of the accident. The two trains met on a very sharp curve and although both were travelling at moderate speeds, neither saw the other until almost the moment of impact. The injured soldiers were fortunate that civilian medical help arrived quickly; the troop train's medical officer had disembarked



in Edmonton. The uninjured gunners, after a short rest and a chance to reorganize, left Wainwright for Fort Lewis on November 29. Merv Tweed, Member Parliament for Brandon-Souris is pleased that the Government of Canada has tabled legislation to amend the New Veterans Charter to significantly improve financial support for injured Canadian Forces members and Veterans.

"Our government is listening to Veterans and their families. The legislative changes to the New Veterans Charter will greatly improve the quality of life of our Veterans. Our government is committed to see that our Veterans and their families receive the care, services and financial support they require and deserve," said Tweed.

First, by amending regulations, government will establish minimum pre-tax income of \$40,000 a year for Veterans who can no longer work and for those who are in rehabilitation.

The Enhanced New Veterans Charter Act, introduced in the House of Commons, increases monthly financial support for injured Veterans who are no longer able to

• expand eligibility for monthly allowances for seriously injured Veterans (up to \$1,609 per month,

introduce additional \$1,000 monthly supplement to help our most seriously injured or ill Veterans.

announcement, Veterans who receive a Disability Award will have the choice between:

• annual payments

spread out over the number of years of their choice (with interest);

• part of the award as a lump sum and the rest as annual payments over the number of years of their choice (with interest); or

• a single lump sum payment.

Furthermore, at any time, Veterans who so choose may change their minds and receive the remaining amount as a lump-sum payment.

Letter to the Editor

Aided in avalanche control 40 years ago

Dear Editor,

In the early 1970s, I was sent to Rogers Pass, B.C. along with a detachment of men from CFB Shilo, to help keep the Trans Canada Highway clear of snow.

We used 105mm howitzers, artillery weapons, to shoot down snow accumulation in the crevasses of the mountains. By doing this we could keep Hwy. 1 clear for all vehicles.

At the time, Canada had the greatest avalanche control of any country in the world. It was nothing to have radio crews from various countries with you while you tried to keep ahead of the snow. Every time we fired it was a target round and because of a super quick fuse it would explode as soon as it made contact with the snow. In order to achieve this accuracy, we always used the highest charge. The target data was also pre-recorded.

There were very few snow sheds at the time and the work could be very dangerous. One year, a fully loaded transport was thrown off the highway into the gully below. Thankfully, the driver had been told to leave his vehicle before it happened. In one incident, an army truck pulling the howitzer was hit and the detachment got to a snow shed just in the nick of time

The avalanche control area was between Revelstoke in the west and Golden in the east — a distance of about 45 miles in all. A man we called Fred, who worked for the Department of Transport and an expert in avalanche control, was in charge of the operation. We understood he had experience in various parts of the world particularly in Austria and Switzerland. He seemed to know when the snow was ready to slide and would give the word when it was time to start shooting. The Department of Highways would close the highway, and all the heavy equipment would follow behind us and clear the highway when necessary. Sometimes it could snow a foot an hour and we could be kept busy day and night.

The entire operation would usually run from September to March. We slept in a building at the summit which also had a kitchen and cooks employed by the government.

The operation was very effective and we kept the Trans Canada Highway clear during the winter months for vehicles travelling between Vancouver and Calgary.

5 Platoon visits Moosomin to pay respects on Remembrance Day

Every Nov. 11 on Remembrance Day, Second Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (2PPCLI) makes a pilgrimage to Moosomin, SK, to pay their respects to one of their own. Buried in a small cemetery on the outskirts of town is Maj G.H. Mullin, VC, MM. Maj Mullin was a Sergeant at the Battle of Passchendaele when he won his Victoria Cross by leading a charge and single-handedly capturing a German pillbox that was holding up the advance while exposed to withering enemy fire and extreme personal danger.

This year, the soldiers of 5 Platoon, Bravo Company made the three hour journey westward to pay their respects to Major Mullin. After a short service and a traditional toast to the Regiment, these young soldiers took the opportunity to mingle with the people of Moosomin and share their stories and experiences. Local residents took kindly to the freshfaced, young Patricias, welcoming them into the Legion for drinks, song, and games.

This event serves as a reminder of both the great sacrifices of our Fallen Comrades in arms have made and of the freedom for which they fought. Soldiers like Maj Mullin, and his actions during the First World War, set a high standard of conduct for current and future young Patricia's to emulate. We will never forget.

CFB Shilo private a champ in long ball golf driving

Not many can hit a golf ball farther than ŽPPCLI's Pte Matthew

Wilson Gunning.
It was at the Re/ Max World Long Drive Championships Mesquite, Nevada in early November that he drove a shot 401 yards — good enough to be ranked 23rd in the world. Not bad for hrst international competition.

"I am happy to have finished 23rd. I was also the highest finishing lefthanded hitter as well as the highest finishing military member," he says.

A natural athlete, Pte Wilson Gunning is a native of Victoria, BC. He played baseball for four years at Western

University, then after toiling for several minor league teams across the U.S., found he had a good golf stroke. This was only after OP PODIUM at the Winter Olympics last February.

"Most of the guys there thought I had a chance after trying out long driving. There was a tournament in Winnipeg later which I won, and that got me a spot at the ionals," he states.

Those regionals, in mid August, took place in Missoula, Montana. Pte Wilson Gunning won it and packed his bags for the worlds slated for Nov. 1 to 5. Each of the 144 competitors there had a chance to hit three balls. Pte Wilson Gunning's best of 401 is not the farthest he's made.

"I hit 424 yards once
