## Flag raising kicks off United Way campaign

Members of the community gathered on Oct. 15 outside the Shilo Community Centre to launch the United Way's 2009 campaign with a ceremonial flag raising. BComd LCol Luc Généreux was present, as well as United Way representative Barry Cullen.

The United Way of Brandon is one of 125 United Ways across Canada, responding to a wide variety of human needs on a local and national scale. Specifically in Brandon, the United Way is involved in many vital community projects.

The United Way's Food for Thought program has provided 280 children in 15 different schools with breakfast and snacks, helping students perform

better in class. The feed Brandon families by organization also helps providing them with over

6,799 food hampers this year alone. The United Way also provides less fortunate local children with backpacks, school supplies and winter coats. Another integral community program that United Way supports is the continuation and maintenance of Brandon's YMCA and YWCA.

This year, United Way is hoping to reach its goal of one million dollars.

"This year the need is great," said Chuck Larocque, chair of the United Way board of directors as well as the CFB Shilo Base Personnel Services Officer.

The Shilo community has a long history of working with the United Way, and has been participating in annual charity campaigns since 1976.

"The relationship between Brandon and Shilo has always been great," explained the United Way's Cullen.

After the Base Commander and United Way rep said a few words, the official flag, displaying the United Way emblem, was raised on the mast outside the Community Centre. Attendees gathered after the ceremony for a \$2 hot dog lunch at L-25, with proceeds benefiting the funding drive.

Fundraising events within the community will be organized by a committee of representatives from the base and carried out by members of Shilo's military units.

Events planned for the near future include allowing casual dress Fridays with each person who wishes to dress in civilian clothing making a small donation.

Another fundraising drive that's sure to be popular is a vehicle tune-up service, run by Base Maintenance. On November 6 and 7, vehicle owners can have their car's oil and tires changed for the price of a donation to the program.

One of the primary funding mechanisms for the Shilo's United Way campaign is the implementation of a payroll donation program. For the duration of the fundraising campaign, CFB employees and military members are being asked to donate a small portion of their weekly paycheques to the United Way. "If everyone gave just a bit, we could reach \$1 million easily," said Cullen.

As an added incentive to give, anyone contributing to the campaign will be entered in a draw to win a trip for two to Veraderra, Cuba.

## Get the shot, not the flu!

## And this year, there are 2

## 1 H1N1 Flu Shot

The H1N1 flu shot will be available at no charge to all Manitobans and enough vaccine has been ordered for everyone who needs or wants the shot.

H1N1 flu shot clinics will begin across the province during the next few weeks. Vaccine will arrive in stages and the early clinics will be for Manitobans who should get the shot first.

#### Who Should Get the First H1N1 Flu Shots?

- Children aged six months to under five years old
- Anyone of Aboriginal ancestry (First Nations, Métis or Inuit)
- Disadvantaged individuals (for example, homeless)
- People living in remote areas
- People under 65 with a chronic medical condition or other risks, including severe obesity, substance abuse or alcoholism
- Anyone with a weakened immune system or those who live with or care for them
- Those who live with or care for infants under six months old
- Single parents or anyone solely responsible for a dependent
- Health care workers and medical first responders
- Pregnant women\*
  - \* In November, a shot for **pregnant women** will be available. If you are pregnant, you can wait until that shot arrives or you can talk to your health care provider now about the possibility of getting an earlier shot.

As more vaccine arrives, the H1N1 shot will be offered at flu shot clinics to other Manitobans who need or want it. Later, it will also be available from family doctors and other health care providers.

## Seasonal Flu Shot


Seasonal flu shot clinics have already been held for Manitobans who are most at risk for seasonal flu. Once H1N1 flu shot clinics start, seasonal flu shots may also be available at these clinics or from your health care provider.

Manitobans 65 and over should also get a pneumococcal shot at the same time as the seasonal flu shot. Most adults only need one pneumococcal shot in their lifetime.



## **Blood drive a success**

anadian Blood Services held a blood donation clinic in Shilo at the MPTF on October 23, and it proved to be very successful.

Bruce Shavers, Canadian Blood Services' Community Development Coordinator for the Westman Region, said the blood drive saw 86 potential donors come through the door, and 60 units (completed donations) collected.

"Since each donation has the potential to help save three lives, this means as many as 180 patients may be assisted by this clinic," Shavers explained.

Lt Ellery Burton, Base Maintenance Officer, was one of the event's organizers and said he was very impressed with the turnout.

"I was at the event all day and it was pretty remarkable to see that people were willing to come in and help out others," Burton remarked. "I wasn't really sure what to expect in terms of numbers, so we just took the time to properly plan, organize and advertise the event, which was all that we could control. The rest was achieved by Cpl LeBel, Terry Jefferies, the staff at Canadian Blood Services and the graciousness of the people in the area. It was

a really encouraging and motivating event to be part of."

"Lt Burton and his team did a terrific job in terms of empowering and motivating people and encouraging them to come out, and reaching out to the whole community here, with all the various units," Shavers said. "I know that's a big job and a tough challenge sometimes."

Shavers said donor turnout at previous clinics in Shilo was "relatively poor."

"We've had as few as 29 donors attending and as many as 71," Shavers explained. "So (this) clinic was record-breaking, with 86 donors attending. With an unpredictable flu season upon us and the seasonal holidays just around the corner, this event has helped us ramp up our inventory to meet hospital demand in Manitoba, and elsewhere in Canada where needed."

Shilo's Chief of Staff, Maj Neil Gregory, donated blood at the clinic and stressed how necessary donating is.

"I think it's important that we as a military community make this one of our regular contributions," Gregory said. "This is another way in which military folks have an opportunity to show support to the community."

Shavers said he and the Canadian Blood Services organization are grateful to Lt

"(They) took the lead on this initiative and worked hard to make it a success." Shavers said. "Their effort to reach out to the whole Shilo community was very evident in the number of donors who came to the clinic from a wide variety of units on base. as well as the civilian community."


Blood recipients aren't the only group who will benefit from the blood drive. Base Maintenance organized a barbecue over the lunch hour, which was popular with the donors who hadn't had lunch. The barbecue raised \$200 and proceeds went to the United Way.

"It was nice to be able to see something special happening," Burton said. "It's a nice feeling to know that we helped people."

Shavers emphasized the importance of partnerships between Canadian Blood Services and places like Shilo.

"On behalf of the Canadians who will benefit from your efforts, thank you," he said. "Your contributions will mean a lifetime to patients and their families."

## **Base Commander** gets H1N1 vaccine

In light of the predicted H1N1 pandemic, members of the Shilo community are encouraged to get the vaccination. "The vaccination is the most effective way to protect yourself from this virus," said Pennock. The base will be running large scale vaccination clinics for military members, by unit, starting the first week of November. Soldiers will be given pertinent information relating to the H1N1 virus, and thereafter will have the choice whether they want the vaccination. Military personnel must bring their travel immunization record, or "needle book." Civilians who would like to be immunized can contact the Brandon Regional Health Authority at 571-8374.

## Canada Post offering free parcel delivery

Canada Post will again be providing free regular parcel service for family and friends of deployed CF members from Oct. 26. 2009 to Jan. 15, 2010. Parcels will be delivered free of charge from any Canada Post retail outlet to designated CF bases, where they will be forwarded through the CF postal system to CF members overseas

Additionally, Canada Post will also continue providing free delivery of letters to deployed troops through 2010.

Due to cargo limitations on military flights, this offer is restricted to those operations served by the Belleville, ON K8N 5W6 address and to any deployed Canadian ship.

To ensure the proper customs declaration forms and correct addressing information, all letters and parcels must be deposited at a Canada Post retail outlet. Mail deposited in street letter boxes will not be delivered.

## Classic car in legacy project nearing completion

Forget delays in receiving parts, conflicts with work schedules and a challenging military life. A dedicated group of Shilo soldiers continue to preserve the memory of a fallen comrade while restoring that soldier's automotive love of the past.

Since Remembrance Day 2008, members of the CFB Shilo Auto Club have been working to restore a 1968 Dodge Barracuda S that had belonged to Mike Seggie. Seggie, a member of TF 1-08 was killed Sept. 3 2008 in Afghanistan. His best friend was Mark Ejdrygiewicz (Edge) and they had discussed a car restoration. When Mike didn't come back, Mark took the project on himself.

Father Jim Seggie of Winnipeg has nothing but praise for members of the auto club, many of whom give up snippets of free time to work on the car.

"We have a group here who are volunteering their time and effort to restore this car in the way Mike would have wanted. It's a real testament to what our soldiers are. Not many would take on something like this, donating their time and means to this project," the elder Seggie noted.

The father adds no one has kept track of the hours volunteered, saying the time was immaterial. Often, he travels in from Winnipeg to spend time on the car with the guys. What was important, he said, was how the work reflected well on friendships.

"What really counts is that all of us have been doing something for a fallen comrade," Jim stated.

Area businesses have also joined auto club members in seeing this project succeed. A powerful audio system, along with suspension exhaust, transmission and the boring out of the engine block have or will be donated.


MCpl Michael Mulvihill adds while the team hoped to have the car restored by this one-year anniversary, the push is now to have it completed for World of Wheels next March in Winnipeg.

"We had several months delay in getting some parts. But it's coming along well now and I hope to be reassembling next week," Mulvihill pointed out.


Once it is finished, Jim said he would be proud to show it off both in Winnipeg and at Cruise Nights in Brandon.

## Free courses for spouses

While Canadian Forces (CF) personnel are away on deployment, why shouldn't their spouses expand their horizons too?

Itplanit Services Corp. is offering the opportunity to do just that. The technology and professional development training company is holding 10 spaces in each of their virtual courses for the spouses of deployed members, free of charge. Itplanit is piloting this new initiative from September-December 2009 in three CF communities with personnel soon-deploying: Edmonton, Moose Jaw and Shilo.

"We decided to do this because we wanted to give back to the community," says George Lobo, Itplanit's Director of Operations. "We already give back by donating funds to The Snowsuit Fund for underprivileged kids, but this way, we can give something through our business that's unique."

Itplanit focuses on both the technological and personal sides of the workplace, offering courses in four major areas: technology, business skills, IT service management and office productivity. Though the bulk of their courses are offered in a traditional classroom, Itplanit also offers numerous online courses through their eLearnLife program.

"E-learning is new to us, and we're trying to roll it out slowly to make sure we offer a robust selection," says Lobo. Though CF spouses have a full variety of professional backgrounds, Lobo is confident that there are e-courses to polish any résumé, and sharpen the skills of any

To sign up for the free courses, Edmonton, Shilo and Moose Jaw spouses of deployed members will be referred to Itplanit by the Deployment Support Coordinators at their Military Family Resource Centres. The spouses will then be able to choose from courses in Microsoft Excel, SharePoint, project management, information security and more.

Courses are offered in two to three hour sessions, and are facilitated by a live instructor. Some take only a day or two days to complete, while more in-depth courses are offered in the evenings or mornings over a couple of weeks.

"We've tried to stay as true to a live classroom as possible," says Lobo. "Students log-in to a web portal, and see and hear their instructor live on video. The students can click on a button to raise their arms to ask questions, and there's a chat function as well. The instructor even has the ability to 'take over' your computer to show you a function you're having trouble with. You're able to see everything that's on the instructor's own desktop."

Itplanit is also responsive when students have questions about applying what they've learned in class to a professional setting. Itplanit welcomes follow-up questions by email, and record their eLearnLife sessions so that students can review their lessons.

"For us, offering this opportunity is a win-win," says Lobo. "We get to fill our classrooms with people who want to learn, and provide our e-learning across the country."


