## Engagement with Taliban claims soldier

Acanadian soldier was killed during an engagement with Taliban insurgents west of Kandahar July 9.

Killed was Cpl Anthony Boneca who was serving with Task Force Afghanistan as part of the 1st Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry Battle Group. Cpl Boneca was a member of the Lake Superior Scottish Regiment, based in Thunder Bay, Ont.

Cpl Boneca's unit was operating in Zjarey district as part of Operation ZAHAR, which means "Sword" in Pashto. Op ZAHAR is a joint Afghan National Army/Coalition security operation aimed at removing the Taliban threat to Afghan citizens in the region west of Kandahar City while strengthening the Afghan Government's authority in the area.

In a statement, Defence Minister Gordon O'Connor said: "My sincere condolences go out to the family and friends of this brave soldier, who died in the name of democracy, protecting the freedoms we cherish so strongly as Canadians. His memory will live on through the people whose lives he has touched, while fulfilling our mission to bring peace and security to Afghanistan."

Cpl Boneca's remains have been repatriated. He was the 17th soldier and the 18th Canadian killed in Afghanistan.

## Painting Brandon yellow

Military Wives Sisterhood (MWS) founder Gayle Raynor has her way, a big surprise is in store for CFB Shilo's troops when they return home from their missions in Afghanistan this summer. Something very hard to miss will hopefully be waiting for them on the front lawns of their homes as well as those of their friends and neighbours.

Raynor, a Brandon resident and military spouse, has teamed up with national grocery chain Sobeys and MWS, an organization she was instrumental in creating, in an effort to show support for Canada's troops and their families in an extremely visual way. She is hoping local residents will purchase and place over 1000 yellowribbon lawn signs in the Brandon-Shilo area.

"[I want] to see them in the ground before the

troops come home," says Raynor, "The community is really looking for a way to support the military family."

A similar and very successful campaign is already running in Edmonton with the support of Radco Foods, Sobeys parent company, that Raynor hopes to emulate.

"It is important for the community to be on board and aware," says Raynor, who emphasizes that the campaign is not about politics but about supporting Canada's soldiers and their families. Sobeys West Director of Communications Mike Lupien, couldn't agree more.

"One of our company's core values is proudly serving our communities. Military families are part of our communities too. They are important to the community and they are customers. We believe in what it is they [troops] are doing and showing that support.


that are here and the people that are out there."

Brandon's two Sobeys locations have not only supported Raynor's request, but have also agreed to distribute the signs and finance the entire campaign including publishing and material costs for the approximately 1000 signs. In addition to supporting the yellow-ribbon lawn sign campaign, Sobeys has agreed to give 100 per cent of net proceeds to the MWS.

Raynor says that the MWS will use the funds to create new and continue to finance existing support programs for military families. The yellow-ribbon lawn signs will be available at both Brandon Sobeys locations for \$9.99 plus applicable taxes at the beginning of August. Raynor believes the initiative will help link the community to military families.

"Once we put out the yellow signs . . . we're going to see the community



## Getting to know you



The words "aptitude test" often cause concern for members of the CF, and most of us would prefer not to have to take any tests at all, especially if we haven't recently attended school.

However, you may be required to write the Canadian Forces Aptitude Test (CFAT) if you decide to apply for voluntary occupation transfer or commissioning through the Base Personnel Selection Office. The purpose of the CFAT is to determine whether you are suitable for the assignment of a different occupation or commissioned rank. This test determines your capability of successfully completing occupational training, and ensures that you are the right person for the right job in the CF.

Often, members ask if they have to write the CFAT. If you wrote it previously and achieved the standard required for the occupation you are transferring to or commissioning, then you will not have to rewrite it. If the results are not available or you do not meet the standard required, you will have to write the CFAT. You may even be allowed to rewrite the CFAT to better your score and make your application more competitive. The latest score, however, is the one that will be used, whether it is higher or lower than your previous score.

It is important to note that failure to meet the required standard will result in your application being closed for the year. Occasionally, there are conditions that will allow for a retest, but 3 months must elapse since you wrote the CFAT, and the BPSO will determine whether a rewrite is a possibility. Therefore, it is important that you are prepared to achieve the standard on the CFAT the first time you write it.

Certain strategies can assist you in writing the CFAT. You should be aware of the type of questions that will be asked on the test. If you prepare well in advance for

your application, you might decide that you need to upgrade formally or informally, as the questions asked on the test will assess your abilities in these areas:

- 1. Verbal Skills (15 questions, maximum time of 5 minutes allowed for completion);
- 2. Spatial Ability (15 questions, maximum time of 10 minutes allowed for completion);
- 3. Problem Solving (30 questions, maximum time of 30 minutes allowed for completion).

You should be feeling well prepared physically and mentally and should not feel rushed when writing the CFAT. Because this test is so important to your application, you must feel at your best when you come to write it.

large reminder of connection between CFB Shilo and Brandon area communities is looming on the corner of 1st Street and Veteran's Way. Acting Base Commander Chuck LaRocque, Brandon Mayor Dave Burgess, and Brandon Salutes Chairperson George Haggerty were joined by local media on Monday, July 17, at 9:30 a.m. to celebrate the unveiling of a new community billboard in Brandon.

The idea behind the billboard is to remind viewers of the relationship between civilian and military communities in the Brandon area as well to promote upcoming events on the base. Haggerty says that in addition to promoting awareness of the Brandon Salutes organization, the sign will be important to the area's civilian and military communities.

"It's awareness as civilians go by and see the sign. It brings awareness to them

[and] puts it forefront in their minds. It's also important for the military people. When they see it they know that the community cares and supports them and I think that's important."

Valerie Thoman, a counselor for the RM of Cornwallis whose husband is currently serving overseas, agrees.

"That sign meant a lot to the community of Cornwallis and also personally because my husband is overseas and he'll be coming home in the middle of August."

Acting **CFB** Shilo Base Commander Chuck LaRocque believes that the military is involved in many of Western Manitoba's communities in addition to Shilo, including Brandon, Carberry, Sprucewoods, and Wawanesa and believes that the sign serves as an important reminder of this fact.

"I think . . . this is a tangible


The sign has a changeable section that can be used to display information pertaining to the base as well as the community and was made possible by the donations and efforts of the Brandon and Area Community Foundation, Brandon Salutes and its partner organizations, and the provincial government.

Mayor Burgess summarized the purpose of the sign and its importance for Brandon.

"It's very important for Brandon to recognize the importance of Shilo and the armed forces base . . . the neighbours that we have there are part of our community."

Burgess also suggested that the relationship between Shilo and Brandon is a particularly special one.

It is the hope of Brandon Salutes, the RM of Cornwallis, the City of Brandon, and CFB Shilo that the new sign will emphasize and promote that relationship in a very obvious and meaningful way that people can see and feel on a daily basis.



## **Supporting Special Olympics**

Fires burned brightly along 18th Street on the way to the Keystone Centre and in the hearts of six Shilo Military Police officers who participated in the Law Enforcement Torch Run in support of the Special Olympics on Tuesday, July 18th.

Law enforcement officials representing all of Canada's provinces joined the Shilo MPs as they ran from the Subway on the Trans-Canada highway to the Keystone Centre in time for the opening ceremonies of Canada's Speare being held in the Wheat City from July 18-23.

The annual run featured 70 law enforcement officers from all across Canada in addition to Shilo, Brandon, and Winnipeg. Marc Alain, Chief Liason for the City of Brandon's Police Department believes the run is an important and visible symbol of support for the Special Olympics and its athletes.

"The Law Enforcement Torch Run is to show law enforcement's support for the Special Olympics and the athletes involved. The athletes do a lot of work to get here and this is our way of showing our support to them."

Shilo MP Capt Pat DiLella, agrees and also believes that the run shows police support for the community at large.

"The MPs support this type of thing because it's a community event. The more support the police can give the community, the better off we are."

MS Mark Farrell, who brought an MSO placard into the Keystone Centre, echoed DiLella's sentiments.

"I think it shows that policing is . . . an active part in the community. We're one big family so we've got to look out for one another."

Shilo MP members were involved in the run in the following ways: Capt. DiLella -Running; MS Farrell - MSO placard; MCpl Nichol - MP Vehicle Escort; Cpl Urbshott -Running; Cpl Levesque-Bicycle; Cpl Durnford – Bicycle.

After traveling through Portage la Prairie, Neepawa, and Minnedosa, the torch arrived at Brandon's Keystone Centre and was cheered on by guests including Premier Gary Doer, Brandon Mayor Dave Burgess, and several thousand excited athletes, volunteers, and supporters. This is the first time the Special Olympics has been held in Manitoba in its 16 year history.
