# BG begins its mission

The handover from Operation 4 to Rotation 5 is complete. The Second Battalion Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry Battle Group (2 PPCLI BG) is now fully operational and engaged in our mission.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion Royal

22<sup>nd</sup> Regiment Battle Group left us in good hands after an outstanding relief in place operation. The 2 PPCLI BG is highly motivated to continue where "3 VanDoo" left off and we have hit the ground running.

Our training has prepared us for the challenges that lie ahead. While we have unfortunately already experienced the perils of this operational theatre, we remain determined to do the best we can over the next six months.

The mentoring and training teams are strong and are demonstrating Afghan security force successes every day. It will be an accomplishment to see how much the Afghan National Army and the Afghan National Police prog-

ress over the coming months as we work side by side with them.

The Battle Group's role in Afghanistan is to provide security throughout its area of operation. This means the Battle Group is responsible for planning and executing security operations throughout Kandahar Province. Our security operations are closely coordinated with the Afghan National Army elements the Battle Group's subordinate units live and work with at our various forward operating bases. After conducting several handover operations with them, we're seeing a stronger and more organized Afghan security force than even a year ago. This is a marked indication of success.

Sometimes it seems like we take one step forward and two steps back. Afghanistan will not be re-built in a day. Every Battle Group before us and every Battle Group after us will do its best to make sure Afghanistan's security state is better than when it arrived. The 2 PPCLI BG goal is no different. We are now at a point where we can work more closely with the Mentoring teams and the PRT to move the campaign forward.

The good work being done by the Battle Group's soldiers is a testament to your support on the home front. It is a hard road to travel when your loved one is away and operating in an environment very different from life back in Canada. He was generous to a fault but expected nothing in return - he drew many pictures or tattoo designs for his friends, and these will now become treasured mementoes.

A very proud francophone, Jeremie thoroughly enjoyed exposing his peers to his language and seized every opportunity to broaden the vocabulary of his friends, but without ever being overbearing.

Jeremie was single and leaves behind his parents, two brothers and one sister. He will be very sorely missed by all in the Regiment and our thoughts and prayers go out to his family at this extremely difficult time.

# 'ellow Ribbon lounge open for busines

members ilitary Marayeling through the Winnipeg International Airport can now relax in the newly opened "Yellow Ribbon Lounge". This is part of a test program intended to provide a lounge facility for Regular and Reserve CF members and their families. The trial period launched Mar. 10 at the James Armstrong Richardson Winnipeg airport. If it proves suclead to the establishment of military lounges in other Canadian airports.

The lounge can be used when members are traveling for training, operations, and when on leave.

It provides an area for relaxation and privacy from the travelling public, and family members are entitled to use the lounge when traveling. Soft drinks, hot drinks, a relaxing atmosphere, TV, telephone, internet access and reading material will soon be avail-

ic beverages are available at bar prices.

The Winnipeg Airports Authority (WAA) has determined that access to an existing lounge can be made available for a trial year at the existing airport. If deemed successful, the program could be reviewed for expansion to other sites which could include the new Richardson International Airport in Winnipeg, planned to open in 2009. Such expansion would be subject to appropriate busi-

The initial test period at the Winnipeg airport will determine if the lounge is used frequently enough by CF members and their families to justify the venture. The trial will also identify if there are sufficient resources available to maintain the lounge.

There has been a very significant increase in the deployments, operations and training tempo of the CF over the past few years to meet Canada's international and domestic com-

in a substantial increase in military personnel travel at major Canadian airports. For example, over 40,000 CF members used the Winnipeg Airport last year. This equates to over 100 personnel daily. It is anticipated that this usage will continue for the foreseeable future. Initial indications from senior military commanders and others is that establishing a lounge for use by members of the Canadian Forces and their families traveling through

Winnipeg would be very well received.

Corporate sponsors will be sought during the trial period to consider the support of the long-term provision of the service. Military personnel will be advised of the program in the information packages included in their travel documents.

the construction **⊥**schedule stays on track, Shilo will be seeing an all French daycare opening at the Ecole La Source School in early May. CFB Shilo has seen an influx of francophone families in the past few years, says newly appointed director Erin Remillard, and after surveying the community, the need revealed itself.

"Many of them (francophones) have little or no English background. For these families, and especially the children, this means not only moving to a new place but also being put in an environment where they don't understand or speak the language. To be able to offer these families a place to come and access services in French is a huge blessing for them."

Remillard, a francophone parent herself, can relate first hand to the challenges of exposing her children to the French language.

"It's incredibly important to me and other parents like me, that our children learn the language and immerse themselves in the francophone culture," she says.

The new space boasts a need for French speaking staff, says Remillard, which will provide at least seven

who speak little English but fluent French - to obtain employment.

"We are hoping to recruit as many people as we can, because we need to meet regulations. Considering that there is already a shortage of trained ECE's in Manitoba, and that we are searching for French speaking individuals - we do face a unique challenge."

The new daycare service is targeted towards French speaking families or those 'avant droit', which means at least one of the child's parents must be a francophone. Children who have siblings who are enrolled at Ecole La Source can also attend the centre.

"The children themselves do not have to be able to speak French when they enrol," says Remillard, "But we make it very clear to all interested families that everything that happens within the centre will be in French."

The centre will accept children from the ages of 12 weeks through 12 years of age and will be likely be open year-round from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. They also plan to offer child care services to school aged children throughout the summer

"If we have a lot of families that are using the services that require longer hours, then we are open to changing them," says Remillard, "The needs of our families are very important to us."

Spots within the centre are already filled up for the May opening with 3 infants, 10 preschoolers and 5 school-aged children. By September, Remillard anticipates that even with additional spots opening up to expand to 4 infants, 16 preschoolers and 10 school aged, they will be full. They are accepting part-time and occasional child care spots although their first priority will be given to those families requiring full-time

"Ultimately we want to be able to support as many families and schedules as possible and are making a huge effort to remain as flexible as we can be," she

Until the official opening, Remillard and her team of employees and Board of Directors, are keeping busy planning for the future, which includes developing an innovative space and curriculum and initiating plans for a natural playground adjacent to the daycare.

"We have developed a philosophy that places a strong emphasis on the importance of children's play and creating a home like environment for the families and children who will use our service," she says, "We're excited about the future."

## New Support Coordinator here to help you

would like to introduce myself to the Shilo community as Christine Howell, the new Family Peer Support Coordinator for OSISS (Operational Stress Injury Social Support Program). Previously the Winnipeg Family Peer Support Coordinator assisted Shilo families but OSISS has hired a coordinator for Shilo. You may already know me in the Shilo community from my 12 years of working at the

Military Family Resource Centre. For those who are not already familiar with the OSISS program let me give you some background information.

The mission of the OSISS Program is to establish, develop and improve social support programs for CF members, Veterans and their families affected by operational stress; and provide education and training in the Canadian Forces community to create an understanding and acceptance of Operational Stress Injuries.

What is an OSI? An OSI is any persistent psychological difficulty resulting from operational duties performed by a Canadian Forces member. The term OSI describes a host of problems, including anxiety, major depression, alcohol or substance abuse and post-traumatic stress

creased tempo and highrisk nature of military operations means that service men and women are doing a job that may expose them to high levels of stress or a traumatic event that can cause an

As serious as an OSI may be for the affected CF member or Veteran, there are also repercussions for his or her family. In fact, members of the immediate family are often the first to notice the personality changes and unusual behaviours in their loved one. Family members invest considerable effort in trying to understand the injury, stand by his/her side during recovery and work to maintain family stability. Over time, these

demands put a different type of stress on family members who, for better or worse, try to adapt to the long-term effects of the injury living in a tense atmosphere where conflicts are common (walking on eggshells). Most families are dealing with the symptoms of the OSI sufferer without understanding them. Apprehension to talk about what is happening for fear of negative impacts on the OSI person's military career or social network is also common and can be alleviated by having the support of a Family Peer Support Coordinator to talk with. As such, it is important that family members also seek help so they can safeguard their own well-being and, in turn, that of their children and the OSI sufferer.

The national family peer support network consists of coordinators and volunteers who have suffered the effects of an OSI and have recovered their physical and mental health to the point where they can assist others. This is where I come in. I have experienced similar problems and my role is to provide support and information on OSI re-

will remain strictly confidential. How much I help is up to you. I will listen, suggest a few ideas, and leave the choices to you. I can assist you to regain control of your life. 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# Missed deadlines no longer an excuse

on't we all hate deadlines?

Have you ever considered upgrading your education, but looked into your options and realized that you have missed all of the application deadlines? Or have you decided you "shouldn't bother taking a course because it will never work with your schedule"? Or have you committed yourself to taking a course by distance but procrastinated (due to life's unseen forces) and missed the school's application deadline? If you didn't apply on time for your course or program, then open learning institutions may be your answer. Missing the deadline is no longer a viable excuse!

Many institutions set application deadlines well in advance of course registration deadlines and keeping track of these dates can be frustrating and can create obstacles for even the most dedicated learner. The instructors are also very accommodating with meeting students' needs. There are a wide range of courses offered, from second language courses to arts and science courses to human anatomy courses!

Athabasca University is one of Canada's leading open universities, and they offer a wide range of undergraduate degree and certificate programs, as well as a few graduate programs. Registration for Athabasca courses is year round, and you must register for courses by the tenth day of the month prior to the month you wish to start your course. Once you have registered, your course will begin on the first day of the following month. Thompson Rivers University (TRU) is an open learning institution that offers independent-study distance courses and programs to students. Programs include undergraduate degree programs, certificate and diploma programs. The main campus of TRU is located in Kamloops, B.C. and they are a member of the University Consortium in B.C., along with Simon Fraser University and the University of Victoria. Distance education courses offered through Simon Fraser University and the University of Victoria can also be taken through TRU. 

#### **MANITOBA'S EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS**

Employees and Employers in Manitoba's Agriculture Sector

### Know your rights and responsibilities in your workplace

Changes to Manitoba's Employment Standards Code will provide minimum employment standards to many farm workers. This includes minimum wage, vacations, work breaks, weekly day of rest, unpaid leaves and restrictions on deductions from wages. Changes are effective June 30, 2008.

#### Full coverage of the Employment Standards Code will apply to:

- Employees in climate-controlled facilities such as some livestock barns or mushroom plants
- Employees of agricultural service providers who move from farm to farm, such as custom combining or chicken catching crews

#### Coverage is flexible to address needs of specific operations

The Employment Standards Code allows some flexibility in consideration of the nature of on-farm work, impacts of weather, seasonal conditions and family farms.

- Farm workers employed on a farm by a farmer are included in most employment standards provisions, including minimum wage and vacations, but are not covered for overtime, general holidays or reporting pay.
- Farm workers employed by family members continue to be excluded from most of Manitoba's Employment Standards Code.

# Texas tank training prepares troops

ounted in LAV IIIs, Golf Company of 2 RCR, charged across the desert to take a village held by insurgents. In a thin line ahead of them was a troop of Leopard tanks blasting targets as they appeared, softening the objective for the infantry as they prepared to dismount for the attack.

Although the attack was part of a training scenario last month in Fort Bliss, it was very serious business for the troops as they prepare for a deployment to Afghanistan. Everything fired during the attack was live, including an artillery barrage as the combat team, based on Golf Coy, neared the objective. A key element supporting the combat team were the tanks leading the troops onto the objective.

"I think it's vitally important to train as much as we can with all the various arms brought together in an event like this," said Cpl Ryan Vigar, a tanker with A Sqn, LdSH (RC). Collective training events bring soldiers of different supporting arms together, often for the first time, giving everyone a clear picture of the part everyone plays in accomplishing a common goal. The tankers rarely have the infantry with them as they train, but it's something they'd like to do more often

"The tanks are excellent to work with, and it's good experience we're getting working with them here in

Texas," said MCpl Billy Wall of Golf Coy, 2 RCR said. "I'm looking forward to working with the tanks in Afghanistan, they're big, loud, and scary, especially to the Taliban. They may have seen the older style tanks (Soviet), but our new tanks are intimidating."

"Tanks have a shock effect, and just their presence can take the fight out of an enemy that wasn't really up to it in the first place,' said Vigar. "Compared to the LAV III, we have a lot more destructive capability. With our guns we can take out a lot of hard tar-

gets that the LAV can't, like the grape-drying huts, and I think that the infantry appreciate having that capability with them," he also added.

Collective training for TF 3-08 is having the team

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in a tank is the best place to be,... but working with the infantry is always good!"
